# Fury over pay parking

Dolphin Coast residents are furious that from next Wednesday, parking will have to be paid for.

KwaDukuza mayor Ricardo Mthembu announced this week that motorists will have to pay R6 an hour for public parking bays in Stanger, Shakaskraal, Umhlali village and parts of Ballito including the beaches, from November 1.

Aiming to generate more revenue, the municipality has since put up signs in affected areas with that being the only communication to the public, leaving business owners and affected employees horrified at not being informed or consulted.

One of the largest affected areas in Ballito aside from the beaches will be the business park on Sandra Road and public bays along Compensation Beach Road.

However, Ballito ward councillors said they had not been informed of the system before it was launched by the mayor.

DA chief whip in the Ilembe region Malcolm Hubner said when the topic of the parking system came to council, it had already been passed.

'We are now trying to find the council documents for when the system first came to council. What we do know for sure is that there was no public participation.'

Owner of Rawson Properties on Sanda Road, Roelof Faul, said he was enraged about the situation and accused the municipality of trying to squeeze unnecessary money out of ratepayers at a time when businesses are struggling.

"Our vehicles take up about 20 parking bays a day and we have no other place to park our vehicles. This is not good for business as it will push away clients who visit our office. This affects my business and my staff who park outside daily but I had not been informed of KDM's intention or how this will work. When the plans for buildings such as this one was passed, it was known to the municipality that there would be no other option for parking except for the municipal bays outside the offices. All the information we have are the boards that were recently put up outside and that is no way of communicating with ratepayers."

Owner of the Galley Beach Bar and Grill restaurant on Compensation Beach Road, Mark van Staden said parking during peak seasons was already a problem and that asking people to pay would directly impact on business.

## Gawler's suspected killer caught

The man alleged to be responsible for the brutal farm attack that caused the death of popular retired Glendale Heights farmer Bob Gawler in July has finally been arrested



## Killed in cold blood

The horrific murder of a waitress by her ex in Ballito last week sent shockwaves through the town.

Siphokazi Khumalo, 32, a waitress at Turn 'n Tender restaurant in the Ballito Junction, was attacked and her throat cut by her ex-boyfriend last Wednesday afternoon.

According to reports from bystanders, before the attack Khumalo was sitting on a couch in the restaurant

Umhlali SAPS spokesperson Captain Vinny Pillay said her ex saw her there and flew into a jealous rage. Eyewitnesses said she went to the bathroom and her ex followed.

Ballito resident Pierre Welgemoed heard screams from the toilets and two girls came running out shouting that a man was hitting a woman.

He told his son to stay where he was and ran into the bathrooms with another man. When he pushed open the door to the stall, the attacker stepped out with his arm around Khumalo's throat.

"I shouted for him to get out of the stall and that's when I saw the knife. In that split second I hesitated and my family popped into my head," Welgemoed told the *Courier*.

The attacker then brought the knife down, stabbing Khumalo in the neck and yanking the blade back. Welgemoed said she grabbed at her throat and toppled over.

"The look in her eyes in those last split seconds haunts me. I cannot stop thinking that I should have done something more. I should have tried to grab the knife, I should have jumped into the cubicle and tackled him, I should have done something."

The killer then walked calmly out and presented his hands as though to be cuffed. Welgemoed and another man grabbed him and held him until mall security and police took over.

"I rushed back into the toilet and tried to help her. There was blood everywhere and I was just trying to put pressure on her neck and wrap it with toilet paper."

She died a few minutes later. Welgemoed said he took heart from the rapid response of paramedics and mall security as well as from the public.

"Nobody just walked away, people were ready to help within seconds. I think that shows the true strength of our community, I still believe there are more good people than bad in our corner of the world and we should not let a tragedy like this make us forget that."

The murder has highlighted the ongoing scourge of violence against women in South Africa. She-

hana Kajee, leader of the DA Women's Network (DAWN) in KZN said violence against women was a growing problem that government needed to take more seriously.

"We cannot just stand up against violence against women during the 16 days of activism, it needs to be 365 days a year," Kajee said.

"DAWN will be following the case and opposing bail. We believe he should be handed the maximum sentence."

Meanwhile, Dr Albertina Luthuli, daughter of the late struggle icon Chief Albert Luthuli, condemned this senseless act of violence.

She told the *Courier* the ongoing violence against woman in our communities was extremely worrying and that she believed government was not prioritising this enough.

"At the very core of this problem lies the entrenched culture of patriarchy," Dr Luthuli said.

"People keep saying patriarchy is part of their culture but that is just not good enough. Black, white, Indian: it does not matter, as we move forward together as a new South Africa we must leave behind those cultural beliefs that do not live up to our constitution."

Dr Luthuli said South Africans must build a new culture together and called on the courts to quickly deal with this matter so that Khumalo's family could get justice.

"I have gone beyond anger and frustration and I think all women in our Rainbow Nation feel the same. We are living with these beasts among us.

"My father - Chief Albert Luthuli - condemned patriarchy as he knew it could interfere with creating a new, just South Africa," she said.

Siphokazi Khumalo is survived by two young children. The suspect, who is 30 years old, appeared in KwaDukuza magistrate court on Friday and was remanded in custody. He will appear again on Thursday for bail application.

## Pastor tackles then prays for killer

A Ballito pastor first tackled a man he saw slit the throat of a woman – then prayed for him.

The pastor was shopping on Wednesday afternoon when he heard screams from the ladies toilets of The Ballito Junction mall.

"Women were running out of the bathroom screaming. Another man and I rushed in and a woman pointed out the cubicle. The guy with me pushed the door open and then stepped back in shock.

"A man stepped out brandishing a knife and as he was leaving he lashed back with the knife, slashing the throat of the woman in the stall with him."

The pastor pushed people out of the toilets. "We were in the passageway for perhaps 30

"We were in the passageway for perhaps 30 seconds when he walked out, his hands raised as if to be handcuffed.

"I thought he would run but the other man with me yelled at him to get down on the floor. We both tackled him and put his hands behind his back. A crowd had started to gather and people started trying to kick him, shouting obscenities."

With his knee in the man's back to keep him down he told the *Courier* that he had been suddenly filled with "a strange compassion" for the man

"I was reminded of Archbishop Desmond Tutu's words with regards to the guy they called the Modimolle Monster. He asked people not to call the man a monster because irrespective of what he had done he was still a human being. That's when I started to pray for him.

"When I had finished he turned around and thanked me. I asked him why he did this.

"He said to me that this woman had been his girlfriend for seven or eight years and had just broken up with him. They had a fight and he said he 'just lost it'.

"That's when I heard that the woman had passed away." The clearly traumatised pastor, who asked to remain anonymous, said he wanted it to be clear that he did not condone what the man had done in any way.

"I feel very deeply grieved for the woman and her family. I cannot imagine what they must be going through."

Hunt said it was particularly reassuring to know this man was caught as his modus operandi suggested he would have continued to commit violent crimes. They are still searching for one of the suspect's accomplices in the attack.

It is believed the suspect in custody was the mastermind behind the attack, as he had previously worked on the Gawlers' farm.

Gawler's son-in-law Ricky Pissarra said the family were relieved to hear that this man had been caught.

"It makes us feel like there may be some light at the end of the tunnel, though closure is still a long way off given that we know there is still another man out there."

Raymond Rogers, a farmer in the Compensation area and former cluster chairman helped set up a fund to offer rewards for information that led to the

> "We got a lot of support, both from within the farming community and without and this money went towards help-

ing the investigating team uncover the truth."

Rogers said while it was great news that the killer had been apprehended, farmers were all too aware that there are many more criminals like him out there.

Bob Gawler was killed on the evening of July 28 when a group of armed men kicked down the door to their farm house before beating him and shooting him in the stomach. His wife Denise was tied to the bed. The pair were only discovered at 9am the next morning, by which time Bob had died.

## Parking fury

The municipality said that the system had been approved by council in 2011, but not implemented. Parking marshals employed by the municiality will collect fees using handheld devices. The marshals will scan vehicle licences or manually capture registration numbers, select the duration and tariff charges, provide the driver with a receipt and account for revenue collected. Drivers will be responsible for displaying the receipt on their dashboard and should customers exceed the time on their receipt, an additional tariff will be charged when they return to their vehicle.

No concessions have been made for employees who park in the parking bays on a daily basis.

Privi Naidoo, an employee of HomeZone estate agency in Sandra Road, said she works eight hours a day, 20 days a month, so parking will cost her around R1000 a month.

"I am already a ratepayer and the implementation of something like this will further fleece ratepayers. As much as I understand the need for paid public parking in some areas of KwaDukuza,

areas. What is highly concerning is there was no concession made for long stay parking and the system is prejudiced against people who park in municipal bays for work purposes only. I am also highly concerned that there was absolutely no public participation in this process."

The largest employer in Umhlali, Roberts & Chaplin accountants, has 30 employees. Owner Neal Roberts said his employees could not afford R1000 a month for parking.

"The council is completely insensitive to the people. The employees do not have R1000 that they would otherwise spend for food, to pay for parking to fund a greedy municipality. They do nothing for this town and Umhlali is rapidly deteriorating, but they want our money.'

Many Stanger residents took to the Courier Facebook page to complain about the new system. Samantha Sankaran said the system was ridiculous and expensive.

"The roads are terrible all round Stanger and crime still so rife, even the parking in Durban CBD doesn't cost so much! KDM doesn't bother about people, just their pockets and how they can milk the public. So many things can be done about crime and the roads in town but nothing ever gets done or completed. Everything is political, so annoying."

Mayor Mthembu said the paid parking system would help to not only grow the economy but to address the challenges of unemployment, poverty and inequality. About 50 jobs are to be created for parking marshals.

"This initiative has been firstly necessitated by a number of concerns that have been raised by the public and it is our key responsibility to ensure that we listen to our people when they speak and it remains our task to deliver on their wishes.'

It is believed that the municipality had paid an external company to manufacture and service the parking devices as well as train the marshals. KDM has not responded to questions on how much the devices cost and the anticipated revenue income.

## **KZN** coast smothered in plastic pellets

An environmental disaster has unfolded along the KZN coastline after the recent heavy storms sent a container carrying billions of little plastic beads overboard and into the ocean.

Presently, the plastic beads - or nurdles - have spread from Durban as far north as Richard's Bay and south to Mbotyi on the Wild Coast, a stretch of more than 500km.

KwaDukuza lifeguard supervisor Bongani Xulu said they were very troubled by this development and that they already had teams out collecting the

"It is not an easy task because when these tiny plastic balls dry up on the sand they are blown away immediately.

The cleanup is further constrained by the fact that the tides come in and dump them on the shore but later simply carry them back out again. Many people have already spent time trying to pick up as much of the plastic as possible but the tiny size of the beads has made this

a very difficult task. Meanwhile, the Department of Environmental

Affairs has dispatched workers to begin the arduous task of cleaning up

the beads, starting at Tongaat beach and working their way northwards. However, the only way any real dent will be made is with the help of the public.

The Dolphin Coast Conservancy's Di Jones said they were extremely concerned about the impact this plastic will have on marine ecology.

"Scientists at the University of KZN have told us that the pellets are currently not dangerous to humans, but they will shortly become more toxic and start getting into the food chain," Jones said.

"Fish see them as a food source as they look like transparent fish eggs and are the size of a lentil. Great harm is being caused to our marine environment and the cleanup will need to continue for as long as the pellets continue to wash up.'

Jones explained that fish will eat either them and die because of the plastic clogging up their digestive tracts, or

birds and other animals will eat the fish and the same thing will happen to them.

"Even people eat the fish and this could pose a risk to our health.'

Jones urged locals, holidaymakers and all beachgoers to help by taking a bag whenever visiting the beach and collecting as many nurdles as possible.

"We have people power, let's use it!" said Jones. The Tidal Tao ocean exploration group had already embarked on a beach cleanup at the tidal pool at Chaka's Rock over the weekend, collecting hundreds of thousands of the little plastic beads.

Through trial and error it was found that the easiest way to collect the pellets was with an ordinary kitchen sieve and a bucket full of water, scooping up sand in the sieve and dipping it into the bucket, where the pellets will float away. The sand can be emptied back onto the beach and the pellets scooped off the top of the water and deposited in a bag to be taken

> However, no amount of work will ever completely remove this plastic catastrophe, and the amount of these nurdles

still floating around at sea does not bear thinking about.



It will take the concerted effort of every beachgoer to make an impact on this environmental disaster.

## Time for change

Today I deleted Facebook from my phone.

No, I am not leaving Facebook. I just choose to move it out of easy reach. The first step to doing something about aproblem is admitting you have one. A few months ago, when I had been mulling over my compulsion to pull out my phone and check Facebook repeatedly I moved the app off my phone's main screen and into afolder, foolishly thinking that this would help.

WhatsApp too, for that matter, is far too distracting.

Part of the problem is that in my profession I have to be on Facebook and WhatsApp constantly as these platforms are vital sources of information.

So naturally I belong to almost every WhatsApp group in the area. The message icon is constantly flashing.

There is no way of knowing if the messages pertain to a major crisis, something personal, another lost dog (lost chickens and rabbits at least keep it interesting) or some inane banter about the rugby (despite having emigrated recently to England, former Salt Rocker Bob Russel remains the main culprit of this).

What pushed me over the edge with Facebook were two things: my Facebook stream became inundated with advertisements and cute cat videos (by the way I unceremoniously unfollow anyone guilty of this).

Then a well-timed article that I read, ironically on Facebook: 'Our minds can be hijacked: the tech insiders who fear a smartphone dystopia' by Paul Lewis of London's The Guardian newspaper. Lewis reports on the Google, Twitter and Facebook engineers (the ones who helped

make the technology so addictive) who are now disconnecting from the Internet.

People like Justin Rosenstein who created

the "like" button on Facebook are taking

radical steps to disengage. Rosenstein has

tweaked his laptop's operating system to

block Reddit, banned himself from Snap-

chat, which he compares to heroin, and imposed limits on his use of Facebook. The 34-year-old tech executive even set up a parental-control feature on his iPhone to prevent him from downloading any more apps.

According to Lewis, Rosenstein is not alone. There is a growing number of tech developers who are now the biggest critics of their own creations. They are taking radical steps to protect their families from technology - cutting off the internet from their homes at set times during the day and sending their children to elite Silicon Valley schools where iPhones, iPads and laptops are banned.

The article makes a profound revelation: most of them are, like me, in their 30's.

We are the last generation that remembers life before Facebook and smartphones (we even remember telephone directories! Hello, just Google it!).

And what they are warning us about is worth taking note of.

The impulse to quickly check our Facebook feed and find ourselves mindlessly scrolling 20 minutes later is no accident, they were designed this way. Trillions of dollars are spent every year on finding more sophisticated ways to manipulate people into habitual use of these products. As a result, the thinking of billions of people is being shaped by massive corpora-

tions with no real interest in our wellbeing. But most crucially we are losing the one thing we can never get back: time.

Time is the one commodity everyone has but no one knows how much they have left.

The old story about seven fat years and seven thin years seems particularly applicable to the water woes of South Africa, and the Dolphin Coast is no exception, albeit the other way around.

From years of droughts to street floods in Durban, things sure have turned the corner and the Lower Thukela Bulk Water Supply Scheme (LTBWSS) is just another part of the effort to ensure that water shortages will be a thing of the past for the North Coast.

The LTBWSS includes planning, design and construction of a new 110 Ml abstraction (phase one) and 55 Ml water treatment works on the Tugela River near Mandeni. Inspection of the scheme is currently being conducted by the construction companies

in order to identify and correct defects that may be found. Once this process has been completed - which is expected to be in the first week of November - production and supply to iLembe are likely to increase, according to Umgeni Water spokesperson Shami Harichunder.

"From a financial perspective, this is one of the largest bulk potable water infrastructure projects to be constructed in KwaZulu-Natal," said Harichunder.

Construction on the plant began in February 2013 and has, to date, cost about R1,6 billion, which is in line with budgeted cost.



The Lower Thukela Bulk Water Supply Scheme is expected to be fully functional by the first week of November.

"The plant is already in trial operation and some communities in Darnall and Zinkwazi have begun receiving potable water from this scheme through iLembe District Municipality's reticulation net-

The 55Ml abstraction plant can serve between 28 000 and 45 000 households (230 000 people). It will provide a reliable and sustainable supply of safe drinking water to communities that had to rely on small schemes in the past. The plant was completed with certain components constructed for the future and ultimate capacity of 110 Ml/d.

During construction, work was created for members of local communities and some permanent job opportunities are expected to become available for operation and maintenance of the scheme.

In a nutshell, the project comprises infrastructure to draw raw water from the Tugela River, treat and then distribute it into the existing bulk supply network to provide water to various surrounding communities in iLembe, south of the river from its first phase and then northwards from a future 55Ml second phase.

Harichunder said the second phase would be built when it was needed.

Jesus Christ has had more influence on mankind than any other human being. This claim was published in a Cambridge University Press publication: "Who's bigger – Where historical figures really rank?" by Professor Steven Skiena, a mathematician and professor of computational science.

After devising a complex mathematical model and using a very sophisticated computer program, he came to this conclusion: Jesus is the most influential human being in history. His monumental unbiased study on the lives of thousands of wellknown figures led to this statement.

Jesus' most important influence is on perception of God's nature. He demonstrated that "God is love" and God is good.

Civilisations have been culturally influenced and informed by Jesus' life and teachings. His life has inspired masterpieces in art, music and literature. He also modelled unique examples of compassion, forgiveness, humility, sacrificial service, faithfulness and love. Up until His appearance on the human stage, these attributes were very rare, and in most cases, culturally despised. In short, His influence introduced a culture of honour and dignity for all strata of society. His influence has also had a profound impact on science, law, good government, medicine, care of orphans, widows, the aged, the physically and mentally challenged.

In the Greco and Roman world, unwanted children were lawfully disposed of or abandoned. The sick were taken out of their homes to die out in the cold. His coming into the world changed this for the better.

Education was reserved only for the male children of the wealthy. Because of His influence, schools for the poor and disadvantaged were founded at monasteries, as were clinics and homes for the aged.

In spite of the enormous impact His life has had, He never held an office, never wrote a book, nor was from a prominent family. He lived in a small and insignificant nation, in a relatively unimportant town and mixed with those who were "unschooled and ordinary men" (Acts 4:13).

Yet some of the world's most prestigious universities such as Oxford, Cambridge, Harvard and Yale were established to further Christ's values and form of knowledge.

Alfred North Whitehead, a professor of mathematics and the philosophy of science at Harvard and a dominant thinker of the 20th century was asked: "What made it possible for science to emerge? It was the medieval insistence on the rationality of God."

## Two men killed and ten arrested

Two men were shot and killed and ten men were arrested by police in Maphumulo on Sunday.

One of the men who was killed was wanted for killing a policeman in Gauteng earlier this year. A police firearm was also found next to the man's boay.

"The arrested men are aged between 18 and 29 and they were found in possession of two rifles and ammunition," said KZN police spokesperson lieutenant colonel Thulani Zwane.

The men are suspected to have robbed teachers at Nomakhaladi High School in Kranskop on Saturday. Cellphones and money were taken from the teachers.

Zwane said the men were caught after the Kranskop community complained about their criminal activities.

"Police spotted a white Isuzu open bakkie with 12 occupants at Mambulu area. When police tried to stop the vehicle, the occupants fled towards Mphise area in Maphumulo. They also opened fire on police and a shootout ensued, resulting in two suspects aged 29 and 35 being killed."

Charges of attempted murder, possession of unlicensed firearms and ammunition were laid against

He said the arrests follow the recovery of seven firearms and the arrest of four people in Maphumulo last week.



Last year, 26 of our pupils failed and of that 26, 19 failed English. Soon, after 72 years, 'gogo' Christina Masondo of Groutville will go to bed with the peace of mind of having a proper roof over her head built for her by the hard work of her own community members and made possible by the local government and the SABBA movement.

The SABBA movement is a non-profit organisation founded by Corlea Human this year, to eradicate extreme poverty through community development. The NGO joined forces with the local government after ANC Ward 29 councillor

Lewin Cele realised Masodo's plight and brought it to the attention of the local ANC government for a plan of

"Currently, Gogo lives with her grandchildren in a shack in Groutville, which is falling apart. The house is leaking, the wiring is a danger and the roof is about to collapse. KwaDukuza municipality will be supplying skilled labour tricity as well as getting the building plans approved. We needed people to step in and help with materials and to volunteer their time, and this is where SABBA came to the rescue," he said.

This is the NGOs first housing project since its formation nearly a month ago. Human said the project will use material from around the community to rebuild the house.

"The volunteers will also be made up of unemployed people who will learn about construction and see how they too could build their

own home from start to finish."

The new home, which was designed by Mabette Vermaakand Sidesh Rajballli from Detail Architects in Ballito, is going to be 70 square meters with three bedrooms, one bathroom, an open plan living area, dining and kitchen area and a verandah overlooking the garden. Green building principles were applied where possible, such as harvesting rainwater, installing solar panels and using repurposed building materials.

# Get yourself tested for breast cancer

The number of people with breast cancer is high in KZN and people are encouraged to do regular breast cancer check-ups, before it is too late.

Conducting a breast cancer awareness session at the Ballito Clinic last week, KZN DA health spokesperson Dr Imran Keeka encouraged men and women to learn how to do a self-examination and seek medical help if they find anything differ-

He said common breast cancer symptoms are a lump in the breast or armpit, bloody nipple discharge, inverted nipple, orange-peel texture or dimpling of the breast's skin, breast pain or sore nipple, swollen lymph nodes in the neck or armpit, and a change in the size or shape of the breast or nipple.

"Breast cancer is also a problem in men and children. So, I strongly advise men to also do a checkup," said Keeka.

It is also encouraged to get a "breast buddy," someone who will remind you to check your breast or with whom you can check your breast together. At least once a week have a breast checking ses-

A change of lifestyle can decrease the risk of breast cancer even in high-risk women.

The following are steps you can take to lower

Limit alcohol and do not smoke. Not smoking is one of the best things you can do for your overall

Control your weight. Being overweight or obese increases the risk of breast cancer.

Exercise regularly. The health department and

human services recommend at least 150 minutes a week of exercise.

Breastfeeding might also play a role in breast cancer prevention. The longer you breastfeed, the greater the protective effect.

Limit the dosage and and duration of hormone therapy. Combination hormone therapy for more than three to five years increases the risk of breast cancer. If you are taking hormone therapy for menopausal symptoms, ask your doctor about other options. You might be able to manage your symptoms with non-hormonal therapies and medica-


If you decide that the benefits of short-term hormone therapy outweigh the risks, use the lowest dose that works for you and continue to have your doctor monitor the length of time you are taking

Avoid exposure to radiation and environmental pollution. Medical-imaging methods, such as computerised tomography, use high doses of radiation. While more studies are needed, some research suggests a link between breast cancer and radiation exposure. Reduce your exposure by having such tests only when absolutely necessary. Eating a healthy diet might decrease your risk of some types of cancer, as well as diabetes, heart disease, and





## Range Rover Velar

By Sean Nurse t's safe to say that the Land Rover brand finds itself in a pretty position within the global market. As a purveyor of premium Range Rover and off-road ready Land Rover products for decades, the age of the SUV looks primed to be kind to the British carmaker.

With the brand offering the right sort of product for the global market, it's only reasonable to expect Land Rover to plug a niche where it sees fit. That niche, as I discovered, is in the medium-sized premium SUV market where style and a degree of off-road ability is prized.

Enter the Velar, the fourth Range Rover in the brand's portfolio. I joined the local motoring media in the Western Cape recently to give a number of variants of the newcomer a go.

There's no two ways about it, the Velar looks fantastic and despite the fact that Land Rover's designers claim it was designed from the ground-up, it most certainly resembles its bigger sibling, the Range Rover Sport.

This isn't necessarily a bad thing with the Velar cutting a more compact silhouette, cleaner lines and a more elegant aesthetic. Items such as full LED headlamps and the gimmicky, but infinitely cool retractable door handles make the car look and feel a bit more special.

The Velar is therefore, in my opinion at least, a better interpretation of a luxurious British SUV than any other Range Rover currently on sale.

The inside of a Range Rover is

where the driver needs to feel cocooned in luxury. In other Range Rover models, I remember being impressed by the fit-and-finish as well as the material quality. But, some of the ergonomics and indeed the resolution and functionality of the infotainment system lacked that cutting-edge feel when compared to the Germans.

In the Velar, these issues have been rectified, with a more logical layout of instruments and switches, as well as an all-new Touch Pro Duo infotainment system which makes use of two screens, both 10-inch items, situated in the centre console which allow the user to switch between climate control, media, seat, smartphone and navigation functions.

The Velar might be smaller than your average Range Rover, but it isn't exactly a Turkish prison in there, with 673-litres of boot space and impressive passenger leg and head room.

In terms of off-roading, the Velar has the brand's impressive all-wheel system which send power to the rear most of the time, until a loss of traction is detected.

Combine the all-wheel drive system with 213mm of ground clearance (optional air suspension provides up to 251mm), the Terrain Response 2 and All Terrain Progress Control systems, and you have a car that is pretty capable off-road, despite having heavily road-biased tyres fitted to most models.

The engine options within the Velar range are quite familiar, with the base diesel Ingenium engines displacing 2.0-litres and producing either 132kW/430Nm or 177kW/500Nm re-



spectively.

The latter is twin-turbocharged and was on offer for us to drive. It made its presence known with an impressive lump of torque low-down and a reasonably low fuel consumption figure during our test drive.

The other diesel in the range is also impressive with 221kW/700Nm from a 3.0-litre V6 twin-turbo, making for effortless progress with a 0-100km/h time of 6.0 seconds along with incredible overtaking ability. This engine suits the Velar best, but comes at a price.

On the petrol front, there are two 2.0-litre turbo models, a lower output with 185kW/365Nm and a more heavily boosted version with 221kW/400Nm. These were not available for us to drive at launch

Another model that we had a chance

to sample was the rather sublime, but equally thirsty, 280kW/450Nm supercharged 3.0-litre V6 petrol. This is the most exciting model in the range in terms of driving fun, with a 0-100 km/h sprint time of 5.7 seconds and a wonderful exhaust note both contributing to its charm.

If there's one thing that you can bet on, it's that in the premium segment, you're likely to come across some rather intricate and confusing model naming and badge designations.

In the Velar range it's no different, but I'll try to simplify. The range comes in either standard S, SE, HSE, R-Dynamic, R-Dynamic S, R-Dynamic SE or R-Dynamic HSE trims. In basic terms, the further you go up the list, the more features and technology the car will have and indeed, the more inflated the price becomes.

Then we get to the badge structure, which, if you see the letter 'D' at the rear, stands for diesel while the letter 'P' stands for petrol. The number associated with the aforementioned letter is the power rating in pferdestärke or PS, meaning a D300 has a diesel engine with 300 PS (221kW).

All Velar models come with a fiveyear/100,000km service plan, a fiveyear/100,000km maintenance plan and a five-year/100,000km warranty, as standard.

There are simply too many models within the Velar range to include all pricing, so in the interest of saving space, we've only included the base model pricing for each engine derivative. For the full pricing, please visit our website at www.autodealer.co.za.

While that might be true, it's the upgrades that the company has made to the system that has made it even more complete for those who fancy a bit of 'bundu bashing'.

Whereas in previous products where the selection of the various driving modes such as 2H, 4H, 4H Lc and 4L Lc was done with a manual gear lever, the latest system is done via a small toggle switch in the centre console.

This makes it more convenient and also means that switching from two-to four-wheel drive can be done on the fly, except for the 4L Lc of course.

Another differentiating factor with the new system is that it is mated to a slick eight-speed automatic gearbox whereas

previously there was the older five-speed 'box, which despite getting the job done, was nowhere near as smooth or efficient as the latest unit.

The next new feature sees the previous Viscous Coupling Unit being replaced by a Torsen limited slip differential. The benefit of having the Torsen setup is that it is a torque sensing unit that improves traction instantly when it senses wheel slip versus the older Viscous Coupling Unit which is a speed sensing system.

Another really impressive feature on the latest Pajero Sport is the off-road mode selector, which is operated via a button in the centre console.

By Gavin Foster olkswagen in South Africa gave their Golf GTI and TSI a facelift in May, followed soon with a revamped Golf R that ups power from 206 to 213kW while peak torque remains unchanged at 380Nm. This makes the R the most potent Golf ever sold in South Africa.

Now's the time to stick out your bottom lip and grumble, because our cousins elsewhere get a 228kW engine and an optional six-speed manual gearbox. Despite the styling changes the Golf remains pretty understated and in my opinion a little ugly with its long, deep bonnet, but none of that really matters. What really counts is the way it drives.

The Golf R comes with four drive modes, ranging from Eco through Comfort and Normal to Race, and I initially played around between the three lesser modes.

I'm not really keen on this "Mode" stuff because my creator gave me a semi-functioning brain to make the decisions and a perfectly healthy right foot to apportion torque delivery to the wheels - all four, in this case.

The car felt like a lively enough hatch in "Normal", and despite the big 19" wheels with 235/35 R19 rubber, the ride quality was firm but surprisingly good.

Then I popped the button to summons Race Mode, and the experience was akin to how you'd feel when stumbling across your mother moonlighting in a strip club - shock and surprise.

The suspension and steering ten-

sion up (if you have the R12,700 optional adaptive chassis control that the test car had), the exhaust note becomes hard-edged and sonorous, and the engine pulls like a steam train from virtually any revs. Steering is precise and cornering ability brilliant, although I never got to try it on a race track.

Volkswagen claims a 0-100km/h time of 4.6 seconds, and top speed is electronically-limited to 250km/h but the Golf R will reputedly reach a genuine 270km/h if you force the electronic nanny to remove the speed limiter.

If I may draw a foolish comparison, the Golf R has nowhere near the delectable Alfa Romeo 4C Coupe's styling and presence, but it's a country-mile ahead in terms of affordability, at R647,000 vs the Alfa's R1,162,000. The VW has 213kW of power and 380Nm of torque on tap while the lightweight Alfa gets away with a mere 177kW and 350Nm.

The VW does the 0-100 dash in a claimed 4.6 seconds, while Alfa quotes a figure of 4.1 seconds for their 4C.

Top speed for the Italian car is 258km/h, while the German offering is good for 250km/h standard, or 270km/h if you have a friend with the right computer. And you can switch the Golf into eco or normal mode, take your family to work and school every day, and then in December set off from Durban to Cape Town, all in comfort.

Volkswagen sells 450 - 500 VW Golfs every month, and almost 60 percent of those are GTIs and R derivatives. It's easy to see why.

Then we have the rather sophisticated 2.4-litre turbodiesel motor which produces 133kW/430Nm.

Combine this new-age engine with the aforementioned eight-speed gearbox, and you have a seven-seat SUV with good overtaking power, great responsiveness and very little turbo lag.







## Game, set & match for Maxine!

She has been playing tennis since she was six years old and still enjoys fighting for each match and the amazing feeling of winning a tough one.

Maxine Bateman was born in Durban and has lived in Ballito for the last nine years. She is currently a matric student at St Johns DSG in Pietermaritzburg.

Her impressive resumé on court includes having won seven Super 7 tournaments in SA, making the KZN team every year since 2011, the SA schools team in 2014, 2015 and 2017 and playing for South Africa in Botswana in 2015, and in Tunisia in 2016.

Bateman's skill with racquet in hand has even landed her a full scholarship for tennis at Stetson University in America in 2018.

Of course, all this success does not come without plenty of hard work. Bateman trains on court at least two hours a day and does cardio fitness on court and in the gym. She also does strength and conditioning to get physically strong for tennis.

She told the *Courier* her toughest match to date was against Minette Van Vreeden.

"I played a match against Minette and it was the longest match I have ever played, I managed to win 7-6, 6-7, 7-6. The match took four hours and I was physically nowhere afterwards," Bateman remem-

"The next day when I played my semi-final I could hardly move my body, I was so physically

"My worst injury was in 2014 when I was playing the junior SA masters and I tore my stomach muscles. I could not play tennis for six months."

Bateman's hero in the world of tennis is Swiss tennis superstar Roger Federer.

"I have always looked up to him. He has inspired me to believe in myself and strive for my goals, I love his humility and sportsmanship. He has taught be how to be a modest tennis player."

The weather was much improved last week except for some strong winds, but the sea and surf improved as the week progressed. Unfortunately the dirty water remained for most of the week and it took a really strong South Westerly wind on Thursday to clean the sea. By Friday morning the fishing conditions were good and anglers

could eventually spend some time fishing at the weekend.

I visited some of the angling beaches and although some had been cleaned up nicely, there was still evidence of the debris washed down the rivers when they flooded. I stopped at one beach on Tuesday morning and was surprised to see that there were a considerable number of anglers fishing in a reasonable surf except for a big shore dump. Just about every angler was using a shad rig and seemed unconcerned that the season was closed. The word was that a few big shad had been caught in the area. I spent about an hour watching the anglers but saw no action at all which was not surprising because I felt that they were fishing at

the wrong time of the day for shad anyway.

On Saturday morning early, Ivan from KwaDukuza phoned me and said that there was a lot of pollution being washed up on the beach at Blythedale and this was in the form of plastic type pellets. Otherwise conditions were perfect but the fishing was quiet with nothing being caught. Friends of his had been targeting the summer flatfish up north but had no luck at all and the only fish being caught were by those illegally fishing for shad. During Saturday I also spoke to a couple of other friends of mine fishing in different areas and I received similar reports. It seems as if the shore angling will take a bit of time to improve and I was surprised that there were no reports of brusher on the bite when the sea was rough.

I was talking to an offshore angler last week who had just returned from a couple of days fishing at Cape Vidal and he said that the sea and surf had been rough but he did manage to launch in his surf ski. On the first day he caught a few shoal sized couta on Rapalla lures and said the ski boat anglers had caught couta and dorado, also that several sailfish had been seen. On the second day he caught another two couta but had to return to the beach early for the trip home. Another angler also told me a few days ago that the fishing was reasonably good at Vidal and he had seen a couple of really big yellowfin tuna caught.

Anglers fishing in local waters found snoek on

the edge of the dirty water and a couple of nice tuna were caught as well and I believe that the guys are eagerly awaiting the dorado that should arrive anytime now. Some of the anglers have had big shad nailing their lures when fishing for the snoek and one angler fishing just North of Umhlanga Rocks said that he had to move to another area because of the shad activity. Surprisingly there was no news of any garrick being hooked by these guys and even the sharks were scarce.

The bottom anglers were able to try their luck again at the weekend and there were reports of some nice fish being boated. Geelbek salmon, big rockcod and a few decent reds made up the majority of catches. The weather normally begins to settle at this time of the year and before long there should be reports of the first billfish being caught, but if the weather does not settle there are going to be some frustrated anglers. One offshore angler told me at the weekend that the water had been pretty warm out at sea so this could be a good omen for the forthcoming gamefish season. Asked about baitfish, he said they had struggled for live bait except for small shad that seem to be widespread on the reefs.

On Sunday a surf angler told me that a shad weighing just over 6kg had been caught from a local beach very early that morning.



On the Road

I've come to the realisation that running in the mountains is good for the soul. As we headed up to the Golden Gate I decided to take a hiatus from "normal" life. I left my computer behind, packed my trail shoes, sleeping bag, camel pack and got ready for another trail running adventure. In 2014

five extremely nervous and inexperienced Dolphins participated in the Golden Gate Challenge. This weekend 20 intrepid Dolphins tackled the race. This three-day track and trail run takes participants through some of the most rugged yet scenic mountains of the Golden Gate Highlands National Park. We covered just over 70km in three days; the daily distances should not be underestimated as you are climbing big mountains at high altitudes.

The mountains offer the opportunity to prove to yourself that you are indeed stronger than you ever imagined. If you never climb up you never get to see the breath taking view from the top and enjoy the sheer thrill of running the down on the other side.

Congratulations to all the novices who chose to take on the mountains. The first day I watched as many crossed the finish line; exhausted, tired and maybe even a little bit overwhelmed. 
